ISIL 15th Winter Course on 'Debating International Environmental Law in the 21st Century'

5th January- 9th January, 2026 (Physical Classes)

The Indian Society of International Law (ISIL) was founded in 1959 at the initiative of Shri V. K. Krishna Menon and was inaugurated in the same year by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of independent India, with the objective to "foster nation-wide the study and research in International Law and to encourage the comparative advantage of the application of international law in other States". The ISIL has been publishing the Indian Journal of International Law since its inception, which has attained a high standard and is held in high esteem the world over. The ISIL has also a very good library, which is used by scholars from all over India. It organizes annual conferences and seminars on contemporary international law issues. The teaching wing of the ISIL – the Indian Academy of International Law & Diplomacy – runs post-graduate diploma courses in various branches of international law. The ISIL organizes every year a Summer Course and Winter Course in international law to bring to you the current developments and their importance in the field.

From academic year 2010, the ISIL has been organizing winter course every year on specific areas of international law viz., in 2010, the First Winter Course on International Environmental Law subsequently on International Taxation Laws, Settlement of Dispute under International Law, International Maritime Law, International Migration and Refugee Law, International and National Security, Air and Space Law, Law of International Institutions, Health Law and Cyber Laws respectively.

We are pleased to announce *the 15th Winter Course on Debating International Environmental Law* which will commence from Monday 5th January 2026 to Friday 9th January 2026. The topics will comprise: "Global Environmental Situation", International Environmental Law Making-Actors and Agencies, State Responsibility in Environment Protection, Polluter Pays Principle and its Changing Dimensions, Understanding Transboundary Harm, Global Environmental Problems- Common Concern of Mankind, Climate Change Regime, Biodiversity Regime, Legal Aspects of Non-navigational Uses of Water, Legal Framework of Environment Protection During Armed Conflict, Environment and Climate Change Induced Migration, Precautionary Principle and Public Health Issues, Protection of Marine Environment, Trade and Environment Issues, International Investment Arbitration and Environment, ICJ and Environmental Disputes, Climate Change Litigation and a Panel Discussion on Decoding COP 30 at Belem, Brazil.

The Society endeavors to make available the best expertise available in the respective fields as course instructors, consisting of noted academicians, governmental, non-governmental, and officials from UN agencies etc.

The course will comprise classroom lectures, discussion, counselling, and library consultation on weekdays. The course fee would be Rs. 3,000/- for students and Rs. 3,500/- for teachers and lawyers. Maximum 100 participants can be admitted based on first-cum basis. Fee can be paid by Demand drafts that shall be drawn in favor of the Indian Society of International Law. At the end of the course, a certificate of attendance will be given to all the participants. The classes will be held at the Indian Society of International Law, New Delhi.
