






The Centre for Legal Advocacy (CLA) at IFIM Law School, Bengaluru, is thrilled to announce "Mukadama": *The Pursuit of Justice*, IFIM-KILPAR's Trial Advocacy Competition, 2025. This event represents our dedication to fostering the skills and competencies essential for future legal professionals, providing a platform for law students across India to engage in Trial Advocacy practice. It covers crucial aspects of trial advocacy, including trial preparation, courtroom etiquette, and bridging the gap between academic learning and practical application.

"Mukadama" is designed to simulate real courtroom experiences, allowing participants to step into the roles of attorneys and witnesses. This immersive experience aims to develop their litigation skills, enhance their ability to think on their own feet and refine their legal arguments in a realistic setting. The participants are assessed on their presentation, argumentation, and witness examination skills.

By organizing "Mukadama", CLA underscores its commitment to excellence in legal education and advocacy. Such initiatives are vital in shaping competent, ethical, and effective legal practitioners. We are excited to witness the display of talent, dedication, and passion that participants will bring to the courtroom.

Theme of the Competition: White Collar Crimes

Brief of the Problem:

The case involves a large-scale white-collar crime centered around a corporate entity accused of orchestrating a complex financial fraud. The alleged misconduct includes the fabrication of business records to fraudulently claim tax refunds, laundering of substantial funds through offshore entities, and the reintroduction of these illicit proceeds into the domestic economy under the guise of legitimate investments. The scheme is also said to involve the bribery of public officials, tampering with digital evidence, and the forgery of regulatory documents to evade detection and obstruct investigation. The matter engages multiple legal provisions under financial, criminal, anti-corruption, and anti-money laundering laws.

Format of ROUNDS

Embrace the challenge of entering the courtroom of opportunity at "Mukadama", where the finest legal minds battle it out for the ultimate glory! With a cap of 24 teams, this Competition promises to be a thrilling display of advocacy skills, legal acumen, and strategic brilliance. Registrations are open to all; however, only the Top 24 Teams from the Qualifying Round shall progress to the Oral Rounds.

1. Qualifying Round

To ensure a fair and merit-based selection process, all registered teams shall participate in an **Online Qualifying Test**. This round is aimed at assessing the teams' understanding and application of New Criminal Laws, White Collar Crimes and Law of Taxation.

- Format: Online Multiple-Choice Test
- Number of Questions: 40
- **Duration**: 45 Minutes
- Scope: New Criminal Laws, White Collar Crimes and Law of Taxation

Based on the performance in the said round, the **Top 24 scoring teams** will qualify for the **Oral Rounds** of the Competition.

2. Procedural Test

The next stage of the Competition shall be the **Procedural Test**, crafted to evaluate the teams' grasp of Trial procedures and legal frameworks. While this test is **not a qualifying round**, it holds significant value as it determines the **order of teams for the draw of lots**, ensuring a fair and merit-based structure for the oral rounds. All **24 registered teams** will participate in this stage, setting the stage for the thrilling battles ahead. The Test shall cover fact-based questions, not beyond the scope of the Proposition, as well as Applicable laws in the case at hand.

Format of ROUNDS

3. Oral Rounds

a. Preliminary Rounds

- i. **Preliminary Round 1**: 12 teams (Group A) will take on the role of Prosecution, competing against 12 teams (Group B) representing the Defence.
- ii. **Preliminary Round 2**: The roles are reversed, with *Group A* advocating as the *Defence* and *Group B* stepping into the shoes of the *Prosecution*.

b. Quarter Finals

The **Top 8** teams, in accordance with the rules specified in the Rule Book, will advance to the Quarter Finals, engaging in intense **knockout rounds** to secure their place in the Semi-Finals.

c. Semi-Finals

The Winning teams of the Quarter Finals round face off with the **introduction of new facts** to test their adaptability and strategic thinking.

d. Finals

The Winning teams of the Semi-Finals round will go head-to-head in a gripping battle. With **new and complex facts introduced**, this final round will challenge the teams' wit, strategy, and advocacy skills like never before.

There is no Registration fee to participate in "Mukadama": *The Pursuit of Justice*, IFIM-KILPAR's Trial Advocacy Competition, 2025.

Eligibility:

Any student currently enrolled in a **3-year or 5-year law degree program** from a recognized university or college in India is eligible to participate, with a **maximum** of **One Team per College**. To register, Teams are required to fill out the below-provided Registration Form.

All registered teams will be required to appear for an **Online Qualifying Round**. Based on the performance in this Round, the **top 24 scoring teams** will qualify for the **Oral Rounds** of the competition.

This structure aims to uphold merit while encouraging broad participation from aspiring legal professionals nationwide.


