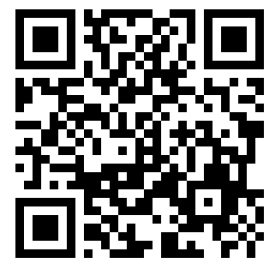

Dr. Ashok Kumar, a distinguished IIT Delhi alumnus (B.Tech 1986, M.Tech 1988) and 1989 batch IPS officer, has demonstrated exceptional commitment to law enforcement throughout his career. A prolific author, Dr. Kumar's acclaimed book "Human in Khaki" (खाकी में इंसान) received the Pt. Govind Ballabh Pant Award and has been translated into multiple languages. His other scholarly works include "Challenges to Internal Security of India," "Cyber Encounters," "Ethics Made Easy," and "International Relation." Beyond his professional achievements, he represented India in badminton World Championships (45+ category) in 2011 and 2013, founded the Dehradun Marathon, and actively promotes awareness of India's new criminal laws through engagement with legal institutions and academic communities.

Recognized with the Global Prestige Award 2024 (UK House of Lords) and Soul of India Award 2023 (UK House of Commons), Dr. Mishra has held strategic leadership roles as Officer on Special Duty at Delhi School of Public Policy Institution of Eminence, University of Delhi. He has worked as Nodal Officer for Vice-Chancellor appointments in Maharashtra nominated by Hon'ble Governor and Hon'ble Governor nominee Member of the Academic Council at Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Shekhawati University, Sikar. He further organized an International Conference on Mediation in collaboration with the Ministry of Law and Justice, GOI and the Mediation and Conciliation Project Committee Supreme Court of India. His book on mediation was forwarded by then the Chief Justice of India. His multidisciplinary contributions extend to cybersecurity governance as part of Cyber security task force at NIELET GOI.



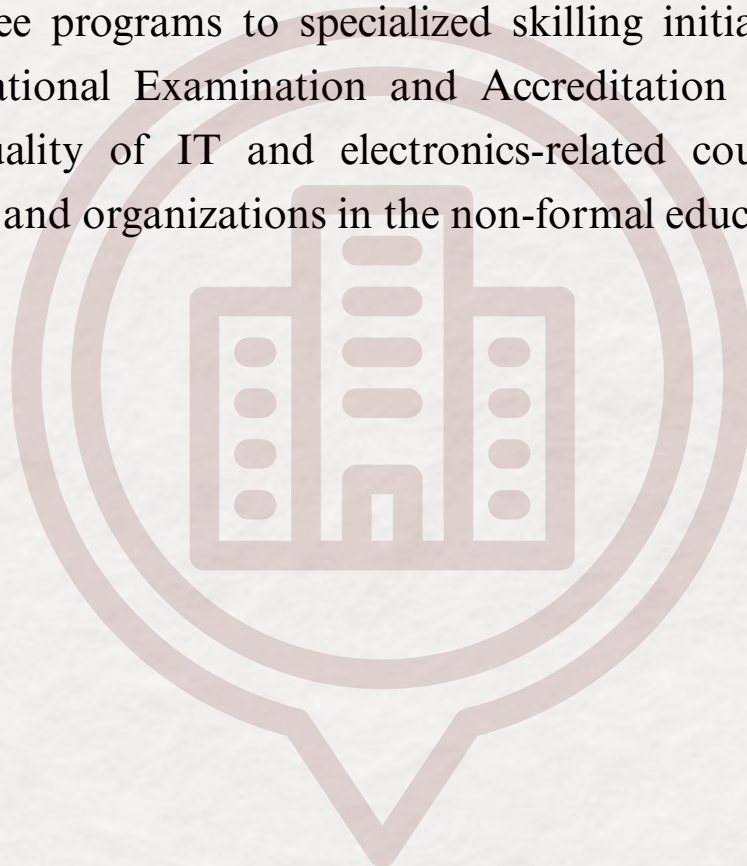
ABOUT RMLNLU

These laws aim to modernize India's criminal justice system by addressing contemporary issues like cybercrime, organized crime, and digital evidence.

Additionally, the conference will highlight the role of technological advancements in adjudication processes, focusing on tools like SUPACE (Supreme Court Portal for Assistance in Court Efficiency) and SUVAS (Supreme Court Vidhik Anuvaad Software). These innovations represent a step forward in streamlining judicial efficiency and ensuring transparency.

By fostering interdisciplinary dialogue among legal scholars, practitioners, policymakers, and students, this conference aspires to bridge the gap between traditional Indian jurisprudential ethos and modern legal practices. OBJECTIVE

5. To emphasize justice and rehabilitation over punitive measures, focusing on community service and restorative justice for minor offenses.
6. To bring together scholars, practitioners, policymakers, and students to discuss innovative ways of blending traditional jurisprudential principles with contemporary legal practices to address emerging challenges effectively.

This conference aims to bridge the gap between the rich heritage of ancient Bharatiya legal wisdom and the evolving landscape of modern jurisprudence. By fostering a productive dialogue, we seek to enrich our understanding of fundamental principles such as justice, ethics, and governance, which remain deeply relevant in the 21st century. By examining the intellectual wealth and legal insights of preceding generations, we aspire to uncover balanced, comprehensive, and fruitful solutions to the complex legal challenges of our time.

CALL FOR PAPERS

We invite papers that critically examine the principles of Vedic jurisprudence, Dharmashastra, and other traditional legal texts, exploring their relevance and application in the context of the Indianisation of the legal system, Bharatiya Nyaya Shastra, and the newly enacted criminal laws. Submissions are encouraged to provide innovative insights into how ancient Bharatiya legal wisdom can inform contemporary legal debates, contribute to the reformation of criminal laws, and help develop equitable and culturally resonant legal frameworks. The conference aims to foster a dialogue between traditional Bharatiya legal philosophies and modern jurisprudence, emphasizing their integration to address emerging challenges in law and justice. Through this discourse, the conference seeks to promote a more inclusive, sustainable, and justice-oriented approach to legal systems in the 21st century.

NOTE: The selected submissions will be presented by the authors at the Technical Sessions of the conference in hybrid mode.

Selected research papers (after peer review) may be published in the form of edited book. The abstracts/papers will be selected on a competitive selection process. The selection criteria inter alia will be relevance to the broad theme; quality of the abstract, etc.

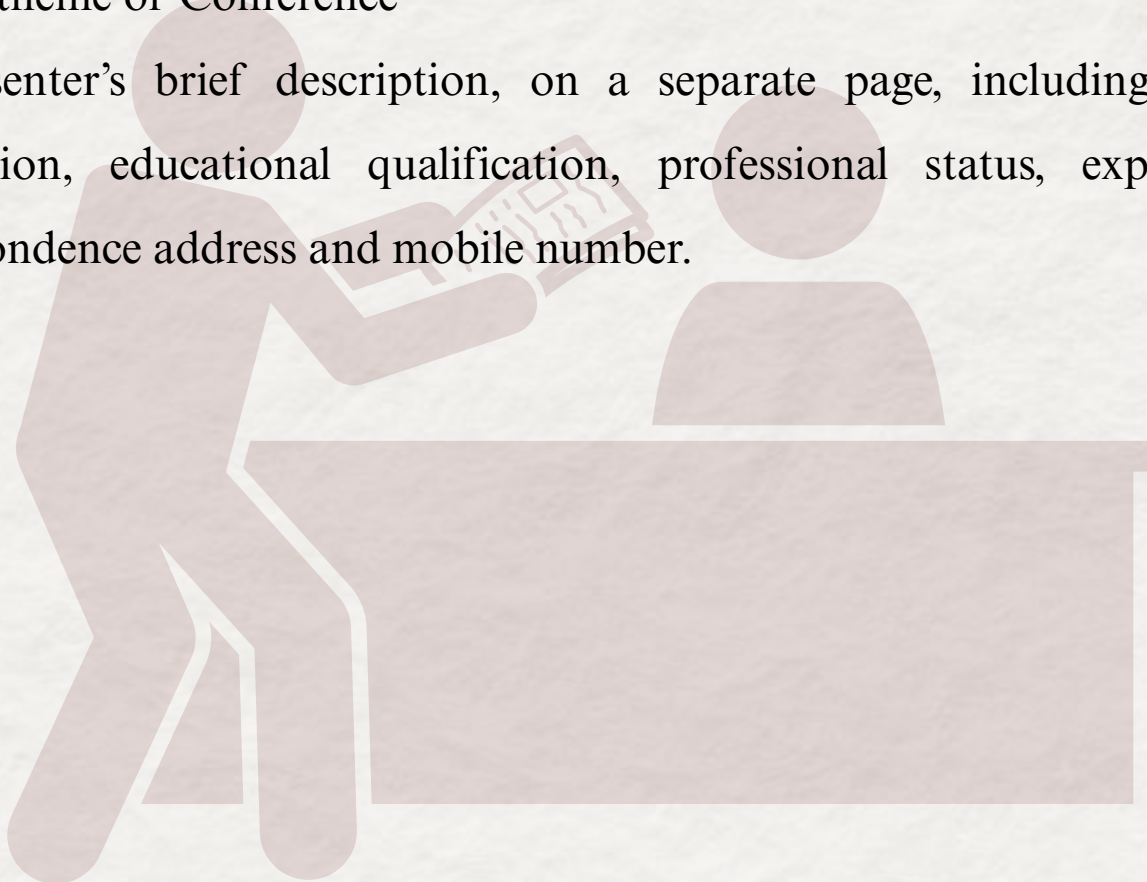
The abstract of paper should be approximately **400-500 words**.
