I. INTRODUCTORY

Short Title: These Rules shall be called the NLU Meghalaya National Moot Competition Rules, 2025-26

1. Definitions: Unless otherwise stated following shall be construed herein under as:

“Administrator” shall mean the NLU Meghalaya Moot Court Society;

“Competition” means NLU Meghalaya National Moot Competition 2025-26;

“Participating Team” means the team which has registered itself for the competition as per the rules of registration;

“Rounds” means the physical rounds to be held in the premises of the University;

“Rules” means NLU Meghalaya National Moot Competition Rules, 2025-26;

“Organizers” means the National Law University, Meghalaya.

II. GENERAL RULES

2. Date: The Competition shall be organized on 25th April 2025 and 26th April 2025

3. Dress Code: Official dress as required for court proceedings

4. Language: The language of the Competition shall be English.

III. ELIGIBILITY AND TEAM COMPOSITION

5. Eligibility:

The Competition shall be open to students who are:

- Pursuing an integrated 5-year LL.B. programme in India; or
- Pursuing a 3-year LL.B. programme in India.
- An institution shall be entitled to send only one team to the Competition.

6. Team Composition: Each team shall constitute a maximum of three members. Under no condition shall a team consisting of more than 3 members be allowed to participate.

7. Three-Member Team: In the event, a team consists of three members then:

- Such team shall designate two of its members as speakers; and
- Such a team shall designate one member, who has not been designated as a speaker, as a researcher. The team must, amongst its members, identify the speakers and the researcher at the time of registration itself.

8. Change in Team Composition: Any change in team composition must be intimated to the Administrator at the earliest. Any change must be accompanied by a registration form and an authority letter duly signed by the head of the institution. No change in team composition is allowed after the formal registration.

IV. REGISTRATION

9. Each institution must register itself through its designated moot court society for the Competition by filling out the Microsoft form. For link, [click here.](#)

10. The competition allows a maximum of 40 teams, with registration conducted on a first-come, first-served basis. Therefore, while the deadline for registration is set for 15th April 2025, registration will automatically close once the 40-team limit is reached.

Teams are strongly encouraged to complete the registration form at the earliest possible. Prior payment of the registration fee is required to submit the online registration form. In case a team fails to complete the final registration, the next team that has completed the registration shall be considered for the final registration.

11. While filling out the registration form, the teams have to choose a primary contact person. All communications concerning the Competition will be sent by e-mail to the nominated contact person. It is that person's responsibility to convey all relevant information and distribute all relevant material to the team.

12. All teams registering for the competition shall be charged with the following fees:

- Registration fee + Accommodation + Food = ₹7,500/ Team

- Registration fee + Food = ₹6,000/ Team
13. Mode of Payment: All the required transactions, i.e., the registration fees, shall be paid online in the account details as provided -

14. Allotment of Team Code: Every team which has successfully completed the Registration requisites under the Rules shall be allotted a unique code after the closure of the Registration for the Competition. Once allotted, every team must use the team code for any communication with the Organizers during the course of the Competition.

V. FORMAT OF THE COMPETITION

15. Format: There shall be two Preliminary Rounds, Quarter Final, Semi-Final and Final.
16. Physical Rounds: The Rounds of the Competition will be held offline and is divided into:
- Preliminary Rounds;
 - Quarter Final Rounds;
 - Semi-Final Rounds; and
 - Final Round
- The top 8 teams from the Preliminary Rounds will qualify for the Quarter Final Rounds.
17. Draw of Lots: The match-up of teams in Preliminary Rounds shall be determined on the basis of the draw of lots. The draw of lots shall take place on 25th April 2025.
18. Preliminary Rounds:
- Each team shall argue from both sides in the Preliminary Rounds.
 - No team shall argue the same side twice in the Preliminary Rounds.
19. Arrangement of Ranking: The teams in the Preliminary Rounds shall be ranked on the basis of the below-mentioned criteria:
- The teams shall be first differentiated on their win-loss record after the Preliminary Rounds;
 - If there is a tie, the team with the higher aggregate score will be allotted the higher rank;
 - If the tie subsists, the team with the higher speaker score will be allotted the higher rank;

- If the tie still subsists, the team with the highest individual speaker score out of speakers of tied teams will be allotted the higher rank;
- If the tie still subsists, the team with the higher memorial score will be allotted a higher rank;
- If the tie still subsists, then the rank shall be determined by the toss of coin.

20. Results: Top 8 team based on the highest secured in both the round will qualify for the Quarter Finals

21. Advanced Rounds:

- Advanced round will include Quarter finals, Semi-Finals, and Finals.

VI. MEMORIALS

22. Strict Adherence to Rules Regarding Memorials: All requirements have to be strictly followed. Non-adherence to the same will attract penalty subject to the discretion of the organizers.

23. Memorials to be Prepared from Both Sides: Each team must prepare memorials for both sides of the dispute (Appellant/Petitioner and Respondent).

24. Submission of Soft Copy and Hard Copy of Memorials:

a. Submission of Soft Copy:

- The soft copies of the memorial from each side should positively reach the Organizers at the Official Mail ID of Moot Court Society in both PDF and Word format latest by 11:59 pm on 21st April 2025.
- Memorials shall be sent as an attachment with the mail in the form of a single file for each side of the memorial in PDF as well as Word format.
- A penalty of 1 mark shall be levied in case the memorial is submitted in any other format or as a multiple file by the team.
- The team submitting the soft copy 5 days after the last date of the submission of the soft copy of the memorial will be disqualified from the competition.
- A penalty of 1 mark per hour per side shall be deducted in case of delay in submission of soft copy of memorial.

b. Submission of Hard Copy:

- Three copies of memorial each for the applicant and the respondent in hard copy must be submitted to the Organizing Committee in person at the university premises on 24th April 2025.
- A penalty of 1 mark per day per side shall be deducted in case of delay in the submission of a hard copy of the memorial.

25. General Conditions for Memorials:

- The memorials shall not contain any form of identification apart from the team code on the upper right corner of the cover page. If any such identification or mark, symbol, etc. which has the effect of identifying the team is found on the memorial, then it shall result in instant disqualification.
- Appellant memorials are required to have a Blue cover and Respondent memorials are required to have a Red cover.
- A penalty of 1 mark per side shall be levied in case the team uses the wrong cover page for each side of the memorial.

26. Guidelines for Formatting:

a. Memorial Structure: The memorial must have the following pages only:

- Cover Page - The cover page shall contain the case title, side of the memorial, year of competition, name of the forum, and team Code in the top right corner.
- Table of Contents
- List of Abbreviations
- Index of Authorities
- Statement of Jurisdiction
- Statement of Facts
- Issues Raised
- Summary of Arguments
- Pleadings/Arguments Advanced
- Prayer

b. Team Code: The team code must be ascribed to the up-right corner of the cover page. The code must be preceded by the side for which the memorial is prepared. The teams must use "A" for Appellant, P for "Petitioner" and R for "Respondent." For example: in case the Team Code is 100 the team must write "A- 100" in case of memorial for Appellant and "R-100" in case of memorial for Respondent.

c. Main body:

- Type: Times New Roman
- Font Size: 12 points
- Line Spacing: 1.5

d. Footnotes:

- Type: Times New Roman
- Font Size: 10 points
- Line Spacing: 1

e. Pagination: The pagination must be done at the bottom of the page.

f. Margin: A margin of 1 inch on all sides of the memorial should be left.

g. Citation Format: The 20th Edition of Bluebook system of citation should be followed throughout the memorial.

h. Page Limit: The memorial shall be a maximum of 45 pages including the cover page and Pleadings/Arguments Advanced shall be a maximum of 30 pages. No annexures, photographs, exhibits, etc., should be added to the memorial.

27. Penalty: A penalty of 1 mark per violation per side shall be levied in case of non-adherence with the aforementioned guidelines for formatting.

28. Marking Criteria:

- Evidence of Original Thought - 20
- Knowledge of Law and Facts - 20
- Proper and Articulate Analysis - 20
- Correct Format and Citation - 20
- Extent and Use of Research - 20

TOTAL - 100

29. Plagiarism: In case the memorial of the Participant is found to be guilty of plagiarism beyond the maximum limit of 10%, the Administrator may impose any sanction that they may deem fit, including disqualification from the Moot.

VII. ORAL ROUNDS

30. Timings for the Oral Pleadings:

a. Preliminary Rounds and Quarter-Finals:

- Each team is allotted 30 minutes to present their oral arguments;
- The timing can be divided between both the speakers according to the wishes of the team subject to a maximum of 17 minutes and a minimum of 13 minutes per speaker;
- The time division has to be informed to the Court Manager/Clerk before the beginning of the oral arguments.
- A maximum of 2 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal or surrebuttal which shall be at the discretion of the judges.
- The allotment of extra time shall be at the discretion of the judges.

The top 8 Teams will qualify to the Quarter Final Rounds. The Teams would be ranked as per the following scheme:

- Scores of Preliminary Round 1 + Scores of Preliminary Rounds 2 = Total Preliminary Round Score
- In case of a tie, then Memorial scores would also be added to the Total Preliminary Round score.
- If a tie still persists, then Researchers' Test scores would also be added to it.

b. Quarter Final

- The Quarter-Final Rounds will be held on 26th April 2025 and will be knockout rounds.
- The pairing of Teams for the Quarter-Finals shall be done by draw of lots.
- Qualifying Teams shall pick the lots in the order of their ranks determined in accordance with Rule of the Rules of the Competition.
- Team will be credited with a win if the cumulative Oral Score of the Team in that match, calculated in accordance with of the Rules of the Competition is higher than the cumulative Oral Score of the opposing Team in that round.
- A tie will be resolved on adding the Memorial Scores to the cumulative Oral Scores of the Quarter Finals.
- If a tie still persists, then Researchers' Test scores would also be added to it.

c. Semi-Final and Final Rounds:

- Top Four teams from the Quarter Rounds shall qualify for the Semi-Finals.
- The team shall argue only one side in the semi-finals. The side of the team shall be decided by way of the draw of lots.
- The semi-final shall be a knock-out round.
- The win-loss shall be decided on the basis of the aggregate speaker score. No memorial score will be added in the semi final. The win-loss shall be determined on the basis of the score so computed. The team with the higher aggregate score shall proceed to the final round.
- Each team is allotted 60 minutes to present their oral arguments.
- The timing can be divided between both the speakers according to the wishes of the team subject to a maximum of 35 minutes and a minimum of 25 minutes per speaker.
- The time division has to be informed to the Court Manager/Clerk before the beginning of the oral arguments.
- A maximum of 5 minutes may be reserved for rebuttal or surrebuttal which shall be given at the discretion of the judges.
- The allotment of extra time shall be at the discretion of the judges.

Finals: In the final rounds, the win-loss shall be decided on the basis of the aggregate speaker score. No memorial score will be added in the finals. The win-loss shall be determined on the basis of the score so computed.

31. Marking Criteria for the Oral Rounds:

- Knowledge and Application of Laws and Facts - 20
- Ingenuity and Ability to Answer Questions - 20

- Style, Poise, Courtesy, and Demeanour - 20
- Organisation and Flow of Arguments - 20
- Reference to Memorial - 20

TOTAL - 100

VIII. RESEARCHER'S TEST

- The identified researcher during the formal registration shall take the researcher's test.
- In the case of a two-member team, no member of the team will be allowed to take the Researcher's test.
- The test shall contain questions related to the moot problem and the relevant law.
- It shall be an online-based test, and researchers must carry their own laptops.
- In tabulation of results for the researchers' test the total marks obtained by the researcher plus fifty percent of the memorial score will be considered. In case of a tie, the researcher with the higher memorial score will be allotted a higher rank. If the tie subsists, the research belonging to the team with the higher aggregate score will be allotted a higher rank. If the tie still subsists, then the rank shall be determined by a toss of a coin.

IX. AWARDS & PRIZES

32. Awards: The following awards shall be awarded in the Competition:

WINNER - INR 1,00,000

RUNNERS-UP - INR 50,000

BEST ORATOR MALE - INR 15,000

BEST ORATOR FEMALE - INR 15,000

BEST RESEARCHER - INR 15,000

BEST MEMORIAL - APPLICANT - INR 15,000

BEST MEMORIAL - RESPONDENT - INR 15,000

- Certificates of recognition shall be provided to all the teams qualifying for the oral rounds.
- Certificate of merit shall be provided to the top eight teams in the preliminary rounds.

- Certificate of participation shall be given to all the participating teams. The awards, certificates of merit, certificates of recognition and certificates of participation shall be announced during the valedictory ceremony to be conducted on 26th April 2025. The hard copy of the same shall be provided to the respective teams and prize money shall be deposited in the account details provided by the winners.

X. PENALTIES

32. Non - Disclosure of Identity: Teams shall not disclose their identity, i.e., the name of their institution, city, etc. or any other information which has the effect of disclosing their identity and affiliation with a particular university or institution. Such disclosure shall result in disqualification subject to the discretion of the Organizers.

XI. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

34. The Organizing Committee shall form a Dispute Resolution Committee for the resolution of any dispute pertaining to the manner of conduction of the moot or any other matter incidental thereto. The Dispute Resolution Committee shall become operational on receipt of an application of grievance, where post the dispute resolution process, the decision of such Committee shall be final and binding.

XII. MISCELLANEOUS

35. Accommodation Details: Accommodation for participants will be provided from the afternoon of 24th April 2025 to the afternoon of 27th April 2025.

36. Copyright: The copyright with regard to the memorials submitted for participation in the Competition is assigned by participants and shall also vest completely and fully with the Organizers. The participants shall certify the originality of the memorials and the materials used and shall be responsible for any claim or dispute arising out of further use and exhibition of these materials. The Organizers shall have the right to publicly display, distribute either electronically or otherwise and they shall not be responsible for any liability to any person for any loss caused by errors or omissions in this collection of information, or for accuracy, completeness or adequacy of the information contained in these materials.

37. Responsibility for Personal Belongings: Participants are solely responsible for the safety and security of their personal belongings. The organizers shall not be liable for any loss, or damage to participants' goods and possessions during the event.

38. Video Consent: Participants are informed that throughout the event, video recordings and photographs may be taken. Additionally, the organizers may seek explicit permission for specific recordings as per the event's requirements.

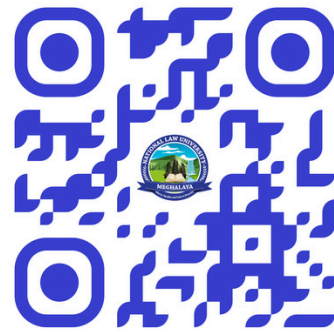
